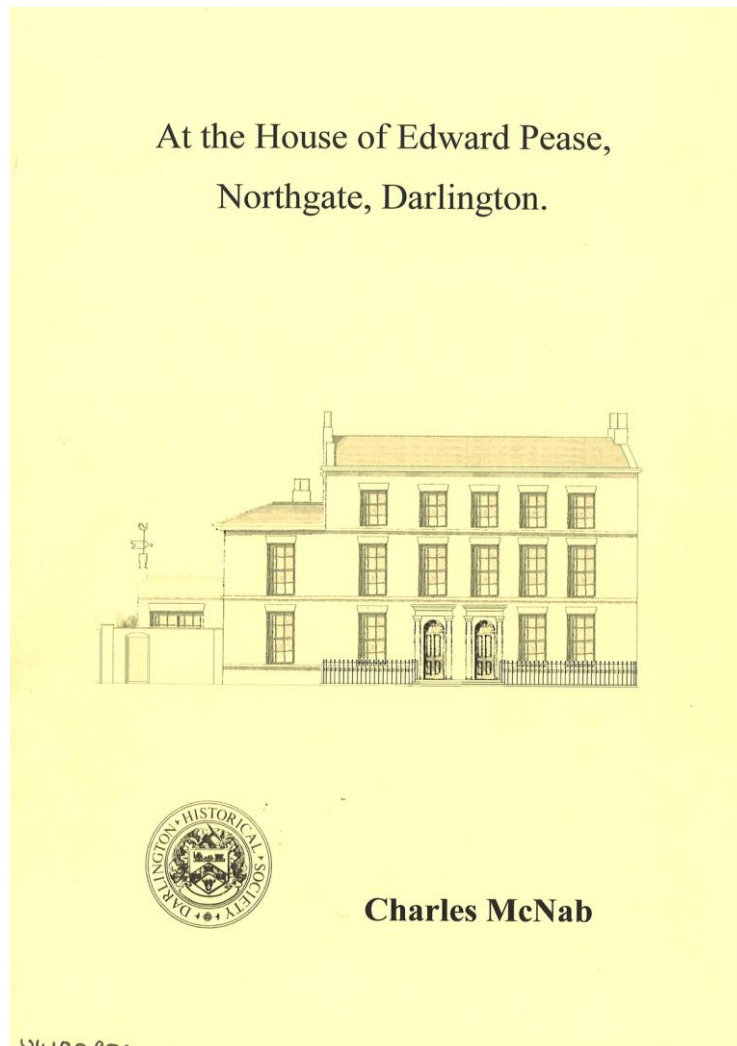


# At the House of Edward Pease, Northgate

The house of Edward Pease, Northgate is where Edward Pease met George Stephenson and there is information about that meeting in the book.

There is a timeline of how the building has changed after the death of Edward Pease for those interested in the building's history.

The book has excellent photographs and illustrations such as a drawing of the rear elevation of the house in 1849 signed by Edward Pease and a black & white

copy of the painting by Alfred Rankley A.R.A. showing *George Stephenson* teaching the daughters of Edward Pease embroidery in 1823.

At the end of the book is a comprehensive notes and references section.

It is a very informative and easy to read book. Why not have a read of it then pop along to Northgate and look at the house itself.
