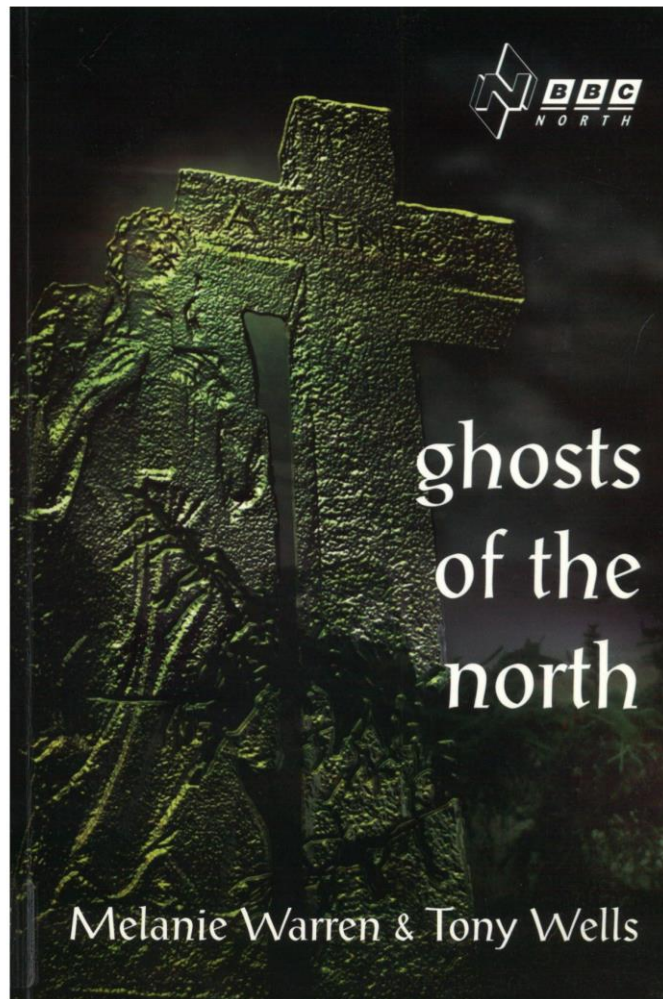


# Ghosts Of The North
